# SHOULD MODAL VERB

## USES

#### WE USE SHOULD AND SHOULDN'T (SHOULD + NOT):

-TO GIVE ADVICE. (DAR UN CONSEJO)

Peter is very tired. He **should** see a doctor. You **shouldn't** be late.

-TO EXPRESS A PERSONAL OPINION.

-I **think** she **should** buy a new dress. Hers is old.

-TO EXPRESS NEGATIVE OPINION.

-I **don't think** you **should** wait any longer.

#### STRUCTURE

#### AFFIRMATIVE:

SUBJECT + SHOULD + VERB (INFINITVE WITHOUT "TO") + OBJECT

She **should** eat more fruit.

NEGATIVE:

SUBJECT + SHOULD + NOT (SHOULDN'T) + VERB (INFINITVE WITHOUT "TO") + OBJECT

Mary **shouldn't** drink alcohol.

#### INTERROGATIVE:

SHOULD + SUBJECT + VERB (INFINITVE WITHOUT "TO") + OBJECT

**Should** I go to the party?

### SHORT ANSWERS

- In **SHORT ANSWERS**, we repeat **should**.

Yes, you **should**. **Should** I go to the party?

No, you **shouldn't.** 

Yes, they **should**. **Should** Mary and Peter go to the party?

No, they **shouldn't.** 

- We can also form questions (who, where, how...) with should.

Form questions + should + verb +object.

What **should** I do with this dress?
