

## FIRST CONDITIONAL

### CONDITIONAL CLAUSE

**If** + verb in **present simple**

**If** we **win** the prize,

### MAIN CLAUSE

Future (**will** + verb)

we **will buy** a new car.

- \* The word "if" (si) introduce la conditional clause.
- \* We use the first conditional to talk about **situations that are likely** (probable) **to happen**.

*Example: If it's sunny tomorrow, we'll (we + will) go to the beach.*

- \* We use a **comma** (,) to separate the two clauses.

*Example: If I study hard, I'll pass the exams.*

- \* We can **change the order** of a conditional sentence. In this case, there is no comma.

*Example: I'll pass the exams if I study hard.*

- \* There must be **a subject** in each clause.

*Example: If **I** pass all my exams, **my parents** will give me a present.*
